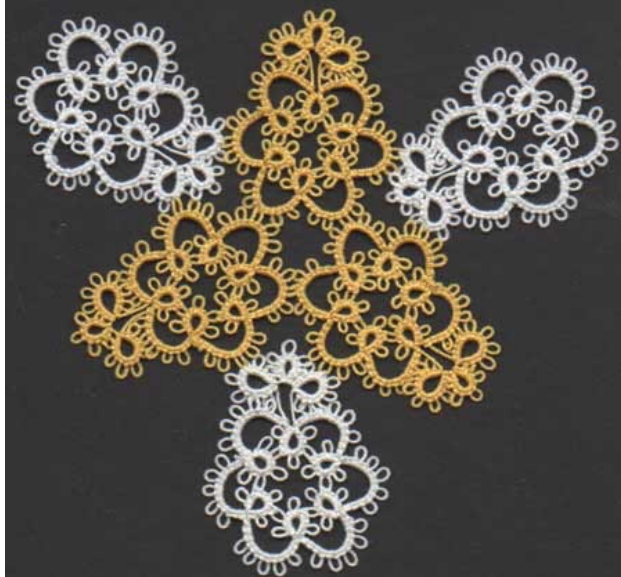

## Tatted 2016 Doily row 2



Here's the second row of the doily I started in January. These are a lot of fun for me because I don't know what the doily will look like when I'm done. I do one row at a time and see where it leads me.

I used Lizbeth White Color 601 Size 40 thread for this row. The design as shown is approximately 3.5 inches (9 cm) across when stitched with size 40 thread.

You will need:

Thread in your choice of color and size.  
2 tating shuttles or tating needle

ds	double stitch
p	picot
j	join

Instructions:

The medallion here is the same medallion as stitched in row 1.

Medallion

Using shuttle 1

R1: (2ds p) 5 times, 2ds, close, turn

Ch1: 3ds p (2ds p) 5 times, 3ds, turn

R2: 2ds p 2ds j to 4th p of R1, (2ds p) 3 times, 2ds, close, turn

Using shuttle 2

Leave a thread space of about 1/4 inch (.8 cm)

R3: 2ds p j to 4th p of previous Ch (2ds p) 2 times, 2ds j to center p on last Ch of any medallion in row 1, (2ds p) 2 times, 2ds, close, do not turn

R4: 2ds j to last p of previous R (2ds p) 4 times, 2ds, close, do not turn

R5: 2ds j to last p of previous R 2ds p 2ds j to center p of Ch on adjacent medallion, (2ds p) 4 times, 2ds, close, do not turn

Using shuttle 1

Leave a thread space of about 1/4 inch (.8 cm)

Ch2: 3ds p 2ds j to 6th p of previous R (2ds p) 3 times, 3ds, turn

\*R6: 2ds p 2ds j to 4th p of R2 (2ds p) 3 times, 2ds, close, turn

Ch3: 3ds p (2ds p) 4 times, 3ds, turn\*

Repeat between \* until 8 rings are completed, including the clover leaf.

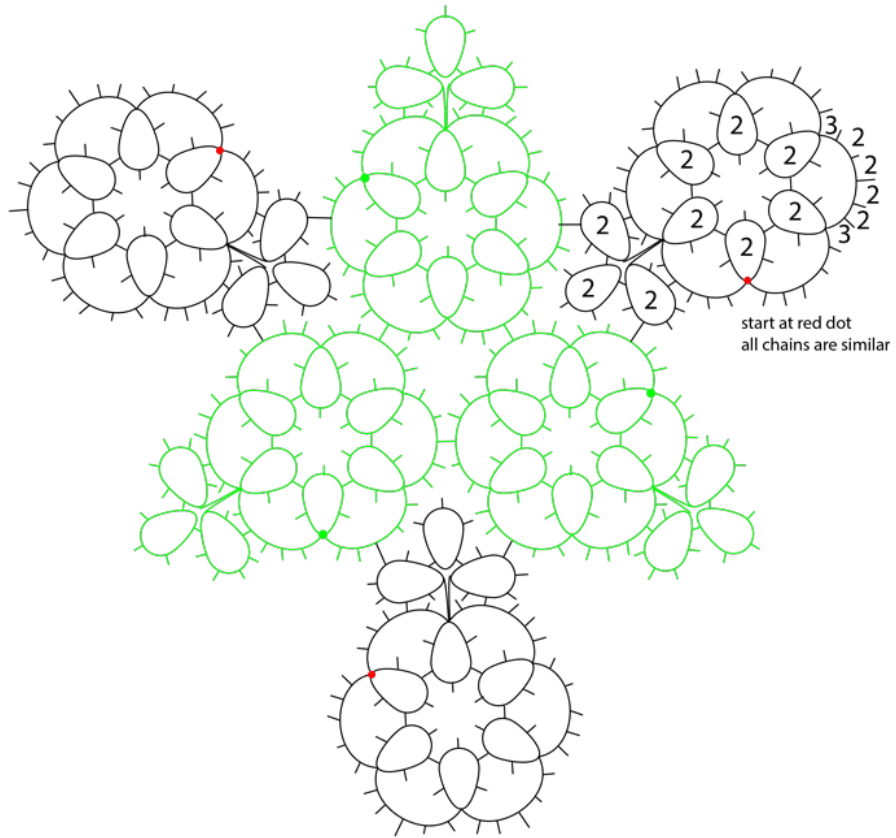
R9: 2ds p 2ds j to 4th p of previous R, 2ds p 2ds j to 2nd p of R1, 2ds p 2ds, close, turn

Ch6: 3ds p (2ds p) 4 times, 3ds

Cut and tie.

Repeat this medallion two more times.

Visual pattern: start each medallion at the red dot. Row 1 is shown in green, row 2 is shown in black.
